DIRECTIONS



If you are approaching from the Southeast or Northwest via the M6 motorway exit at junction 1.

- Take the A426 towards Rugby. Go straight across the first four roundabouts passing under a disused railway viaduct.
- Then go right around the roundabout and come back towards the viaduct. Consul Road is the first left by the Peugeot garage. The boatyard entrance is 200 yards on the right.

BY ROAD

- Take the A427 towards Lutterworth/Rugby.
- Turn left at the traffi c lights onto A426 Rugby for 4 miles.
- At the junction of the A426 and M6 motorway follow instructions as above.
- If you are approaching from the South via the A426 you will come through the village of Dunchurch.
- Take all signs that direct you to the M6 North. Follow the road towards Rugby town centre (A426) and still keep following all the signs to M6 North. This will eventually bring you to Avon Mill Roundabout.
- Turn right at this roundabout and travel up the dual carriageway, turning left just past the viaduct onto Consul Road. (Consul Road is the first left after the viaduct) The boatyard entrance is 200 yards on the right

FROM AIRPORTS



FEATURED ROUTES 7 Nights +

BANBURY & RETURN, 7 Nights

Cruising Time Per day: 6 Hrs • Total: 35 Hrs • Locks: 50

- This is a good cruise for first timers and takes you through the Cotswold countryside.
- Takes you down the North Oxford Canal via Braunston and Napton Junctions.
- Onto the South Oxford Canal, renowned for its meandering route to the Thames.

MARKET HARBOROUGH & RETURN, 7 Nights

Cruising Time Per day: 6 Hrs • Total: 44 Hrs • Locks: 52

- Popular with those seeking something different- if you don't mind a bit of exercise.
- Cruise up the Grand Union Canal to Norton, then up the Leicester section for a short while towards Leicester.
- On the way to Market Harborough you will encounter two tunnels, two sets of staircase locks and mile after mile of open countryside.

LEICESTER/EAST MIDLANDS RING, 14 Nights

Cruising Time Per day: 6 Hrs • Total: 78 Hrs • Locks: 101

- A pleasant two week cruise through parts of Staffordshire, Warwickshire, Leicestershire and Derbyshire.
- This route takes you up the Grand Union Canal to the Foxton flight of locks then onto Leicester itself where you join the River Soar.

ASHBY CANAL & RETURN, 7 Nights

Cruising Time Per day: 5 Hrs • Total: 26 Hrs • Locks: 2

- This route takes you north from the marina up towards Snarestone.
- Why not stop off and visit Bosworth Battlefield (see www.bosworthbattlefield.com)
- A relaxing route enjoying the canal views.

OXFORD & RETURN, 10-11 Nights

Cruising Time Per day: 6 Hrs • Total: 61 Hrs • Locks: 82

• A popular longer route from Rugby which can also be started from Gayton and Union Wharf.

THE WARWICKSHIRE RING, 7 Nights

Cruising Time Per day: 7 Hrs • Total: 55 Hrs • Locks: 100

- Another popular route with the option to moor at the heart of Birmingham.
- It includes the spectacular Hatton Locks and takes in the rural areas of the Grand Union Canal.
- Why not stop off at Coventry and go to the war-torn cathedral?
- The areas around Tamworth have Drayton Manor (www.draytonmanor.co.uk) and the Snow Dome (www.snowdome.co.uk).
- How could you come to Warwickshire without visiting Warwick Castle? (www.warwick-uk.co.uk).
- On a two week cruise you can include a trip along the Ashby Canal.

SHORT BREAKS 3/4 Nights

NORTON JUNCTION & RETURN, 3 Nights

Cruising Time Per day: 6 Hrs • Total: 14 Hrs • Locks: 18 A delightful short break cruising along the Oxford canal south until you meet the junction with the Grand Union at Bruanston.

(Some experience required)

NAPTON & RETURN (OXFORD), 3 Nights

Cruising Time Per day: 7 Hrs • Total: 14 Hrs • Locks: 6

An ideal route for first timers- with a taste of everything, locks, countryside and towns. Travel South along the Oxford canal and then West onto the Grand Union.

HINCKLEY & RETURN, 3 Nights

Cruising Time Per day: 7 Hrs • Total: 17 Hrs • Locks: 2

An easy route travelling up the Oxford canal to Hawkesbury Junction and onto the Coventry canal for a short while before taking a right onto the Ashby- A 31 mile stretch of lock free cruising.

3 Nights will take you to Hinckley Wharf, but in a 4 night break you could get as far as Market Bosworth and visit the famous historical battlefield.
